Whether you're chasing a competitive challenge or a relaxing round on vacation, Crossville's diverse golf offerings deliver the perfect blend of sport, scenery, and Southern hospitality.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

Crossville is an outdoor lover's paradise, surrounded by the natural beauty of the Cumberland Plateau. With more than 25 scenic hiking trails and access to some of Tennessee's most celebrated state parks, visitors can explore everything from peaceful forest loops to rugged backcountry adventures. Cumberland Mountain State Park offers miles of trails, a picturesque lake, and rich natural history, while nearby gems like Fall Creek Falls State Park, Big South Fork National River & Recreation Area, and Catoosa Wildlife Management Area provide breathtaking waterfalls, dramatic gorges, and expansive wilderness to explore. And for those seeking a true Appalachian challenge, the renowned Cumberland Trail winds directly through the region, offering unforgettable views and a taste of Tennessee's wild beauty. Whether you're hiking, camping, or simply soaking in the vistas, Crossville is your gateway to outdoor adventure on the Plateau.

HIT THE TRAILS

Nestled atop the scenic Cumberland Plateau in Crossville, **Cumberland Mountain State Park** spans 1,720 acres of forested tranquility, rustic cabins, and outdoor adventure. Whether you're picnicking lakeside, swimming, hiking nearly 14 miles of trails—from easy strolls to rugged overnight treks—or casting a line for bass and bluegill, the park delivers unforgettable outdoor variety. Cozy cabins and more than 145 tent and RV campsites offer peaceful overnight stays just minutes from I-40.

Within Crossville's city limits, **Obed River Park** offers 2.1 miles of paved walking trails along the Obed River. Also, as a Level 1 arboretum, the trail features 60 species of flora identified with markers.

There are over 40 miles of the **Cumberland Trail** in Cumberland County, including the scenic vistas at Crab Orchard's **Black Mountain** and **Brady Mountain** overlooking Grassy Cove, as well as the lush creekside of the **Devil's Breakfast Table** near Daddy's Creek and the spectacular waterfall at **Ozone Falls** in Westel.

It's no wonder hiking has become one of **Fairfield Glade's** most popular recreational activities. A well-marked, well-maintained system of trails range from paved walking surfaces connecting most of Fairfield Glade's amenities, to more challenging paths through enchanted looking forests.

BE A SPORT

Centennial Park is home to some of the region's best baseball and softball facilities, designed to host tournaments of every size. The park features multiple lighted fields with well-maintained turf, full dugouts, modern scoreboards, and convenient spectator seating. With dedicated warm-up areas, concessions, and ample parking, it's a favorite destination for youth leagues, high school teams, and regional championship tournaments.

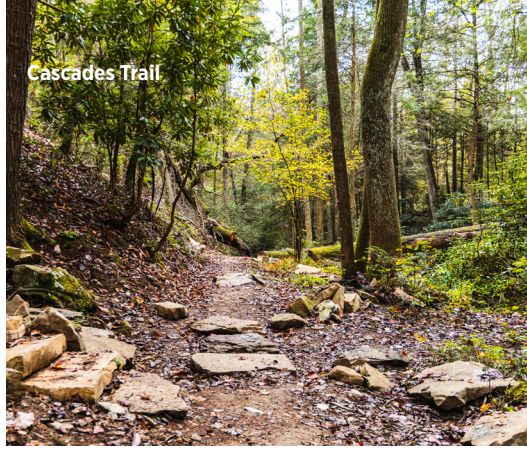
Duer Soccer Complex features six regulation-sized soccer fields on 13.7 acres. The six fields can be divided into as many as 24 youth fields.

Recently revitalized, **Garrison Park** is now home to a splash pad, an inclusive playground, a walking trail, a basketball court, and general-purpose fields in the heart of Crossville.

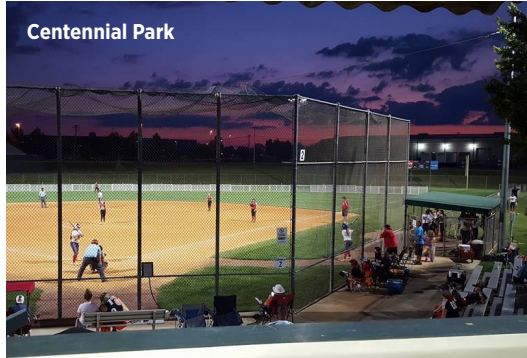
Crossville's 300-acre **Meadow Park Lake** is considered to be one of the best fishing lakes in the state, where one can enjoy peace and tranquility while angling. Fishing is not the only recreational opportunity, as camping, boat rentals, hiking trails, concessions, as well as a marina, and bait shop are offered to visitors and residents alike. The growing park also features a spectacular 18-hole, public disc golf course.

Discover a premier competitive shooting venue at **Crossville Shooting Sports Park**. This modern sports complex features multiple skeet, trap, and sporting-clays layouts alongside an Olympic-style bunker trap and state-of-the-art archery and pistol/rifle facilities. With tournament-grade infrastructure and a focus on safety and performance, it's the go-to destination for regional shooting sports events, group outings, and elite competition.

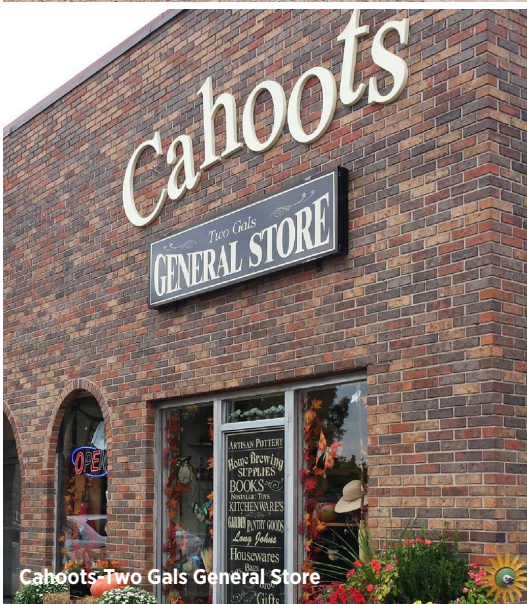

ARTS & CULTURE

Heavily influenced by visual, performing, and literary arts, Crossville offers an exciting array of cultural experiences. From live performances and local music to galleries, exhibits, and creative workshops, the community celebrates artistry in all its forms. No matter your interest, you'll find plenty of opportunities to be inspired and entertained.

THEATER & LIVE EVENTS

Cumberland County Playhouse stands as a powerhouse of performing arts—and a proud local treasure since 1965. Celebrated as one of rural America's top professional theaters and the only rural nonprofit major cultural institution in Tennessee, this dynamic venue draws over 100,000 visitors each year to enjoy nearly 500 performances and 1,600 theatrical arts classes across its two indoor stages and two open-air venues.

The Palace Theatre: Opened in 1938, the Palace Theatre stands as a beautifully restored landmark and cultural treasure on Crossville's Main Street. Once a classic small-town movie house, it now hosts live music, theatrical productions, movies, and special events—bringing arts of all styles to life with top-quality sound, lighting, and historic artistry.

VISUAL ARTS

Plateau Creative Arts Center (also known as the Art Guild of Fairfield Glade) offers an ever-growing lineup of rotating art exhibits, hands-on classes in mediums ranging from ceramics and fused glass to watercolor, jewelry, and mixed media, plus signature events like "Art in the Park" and gallery opening nights.

LIVE MUSIC

Downtown Crossville is the place for live music on the Plateau. Enjoy an array of local bands and live singer-songwriters regularly at **Social Brew**, and a weekly showcase of local and regional musicians for the outdoor summer concert series, **Thursdays at the Amp**. Venture out to Lake Tansi Village on Wednesdays for the **Lake Tansi Summer Music Series**. The **Cumberland County Community Band** performs free classical or jazz concerts throughout the year at the CCHS auditorium, while **COCCO (Children of Cumberland County Orchestra)** offers children the opportunity to learn an instrument and perform with the group in seasonal concerts.

HISTORY

From hardscrabble pioneer days to a retirement destination, the history of Cumberland County is filled with inspiration and progress. Here are some highlights curated for history buffs and lifelong learners.

Historic Crossville Depot: Once a bustling railroad hub that shaped the region's growth, this beautifully restored depot now serves as a welcome center offering a charming gift shop filled with "Made in Tennessee" treasures, a versatile meeting room for community and private events, and the delightful Caboose Museum—a nostalgic gem sure to enchant both adults and kids.

Homesteads Tower Museum: Built in 1937–38 as the administrative centerpiece of Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal homesteading initiative, this striking octagonal stone tower now houses richly detailed exhibits spread across four beautifully paneled rooms, plus a charming gift shop. Ascend the winding 97-step staircase to reach the lookout platform and enjoy sweeping views of the original homesteader farms—a dramatic panorama that connects visitors to the resilience and community spirit of the Cumberland Plateau.

Military Museum of the Upper Cumberland: This compelling museum showcases a stunning collection of military artifacts—from vintage uniforms and personal letters to restored equipment and immersive displays—each one telling a unique story of devotion across America's past conflicts.

Civil War Trails: Cumberland County is home to three Tennessee Civil War Trails markers, location Downtown on Main Street, in the historic Grassy Cove community, and near the Cumberland Mountain State Park bridge.

Pioneer Hall Museum: Originally constructed in the late 1800s by Reverend Benjamin Dodge and the American Missionary Association, this historic school building in the Pleasant Hill community served generations as a dormitory, classroom, library, and vital center of learning and care. Today, it showcases vivid exhibits—complete with a country store, dormitory rooms, the principal's office, healthcare tools, and arts-and-crafts displays. Also honoring pioneering medical trailblazers like Dr. May Wharton, the museum offers a touching tribute to education, compassion, and community spirit.

Enjoy teppanyaki, sushi and Asian fusion favorites at **Ah Mah & Son**. **Express Lunch** is the go-to spot for fast, fresh soups, salads and sandwiches in a friendly atmosphere. Celebrate at **Las Margaritas Mexican Restaurant** with authentic Mexican cuisine in a festive, family-friendly setting.

Family-style Southern cooking is alive in Crossville!

Follow the crowd to **Family Ties** for generous, affordable portions for breakfast and lunch in a cozy diner that's always packed, but worth the wait! **The Country Kitchen on Main** serves up classics like meatloaf, country-fried steak and daily lunch and breakfast specials.

PUBS & STEAKHOUSES

Expect more than meat and potatoes at these local favorites!

Vegas Steakhouse has served hand-cut steaks, seafood, pasta and cocktails to a dedicated crowd of regulars for over two decades. Try the local favorite "Confused Shrimp" at **Forte's on the Square** along with Italian favorites and high-quality steaks in an elegant, historic venue. Gourmet burgers and fish and chips abound at **Dublin's Crossing**, an Irish pub housed in a restored railroad depot. **The Beef & Barrel's** vast menu is sure to please steak, seafood and salad lovers alike. Try award-winning wings, giant burgers and a great beer selection at **Christy's Pub Grub** in the heart of Main Street. Enjoy the patio at **Bunker's Grill** for sports, karaoke and cornhole along with pub favorites like nachos, burgers and wings.

COFFEE & BRUNCH

Fuel up your morning at one of Crossville's many cafés and coffeehouses.

Curl up with a cup of artisanal coffee brewed with locally roasted beans along with a well-crafted breakfast or pastry in a cozy, historic space at **Grinder House Coffee Shop**. Enjoy scratch-made lattes (or "mud") and farm-to-table brunch offerings in a restored Rock City barn at the **Mud N' Grub Kitchen** at Dirty's Girl's Nursery. Great coffee and breakfast wraps for a great cause await at the sunny **Common Grounds Coffee Shop**, where the café offers meaningful employment to individuals with physical and intellectual disabilities. Drive through one of **Bloom Coffee & Espresso's** three locations for fresh-brewed coffee, seasonal specials and a rotating pastry selection.

LOCAL LIBATIONS

Experience brews, views and socialize at our local breweries and wineries.

Swing on over to **Swing On Brewing** north of Crossville, a golf-themed micro-brewery serving up award-winning craft beer like Mrs. Crane's Blueberry Ale and the Caddy Shack Special Stout. Nearby **Bristow Road Winery** pours a large selection of high-quality local wines and features regular Singo and trivia nights, along with food trucks. It's worth a drive down Hwy. 127S to visit **Creekside Brewing Company** for lovingly hand-crafted beers and outstanding Texas-style barbecue. Rub shoulders with the locals at **Social Brew** on Main Street for an evolving list of local and regional craft beers, live music, weekly trivia and food trucks.

SWEET TOOTH

Leave room for dessert at these bakeries and sweet spots!

Grab a gorgeous cupcake or pastry at the charming **Shirley's Cupcake Boutique**. Spot the **Miss Miller's Donuts** truck, and you'll find Crossville's best donuts. Grab a scoop after a show at **Encore Ice Cream** inside the Palace Theatre. If your tastes lean toward frozen yogurt, **Dominick's Froyo & Ice Cream** has you covered. **The Custard Cabin** is a Fairfield Glade favorite for frozen treats, while **La Michoacana** offers homemade ice cream and sweets with a Latin-American flair.

DOWNTOWN DAY TRIP

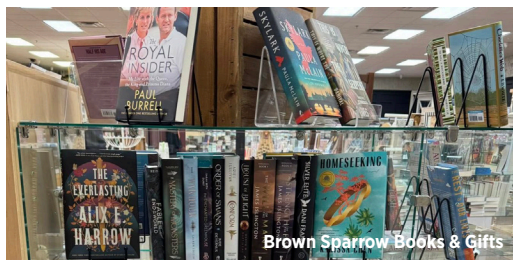
Explore Crossville's charming downtown.

APPLES FOR DAYS

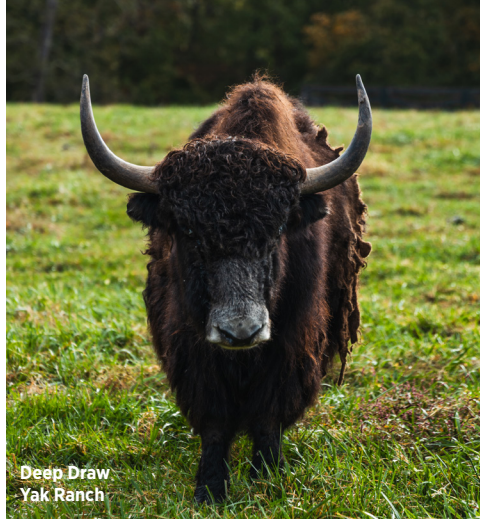
Open seasonally from August to November, **Rowell's Apple House and Orchard** offers 23 different apple varieties with new varieties being offered each year. Family-owned and operated for generations, they pre-pick and sell the apples right off the farm. Located six miles east of Crossville on US Highway 70, Rowell's is halfway between I-40's Crab Orchard exit 329 and the Peavine Road exit 322 on US Hwy 70.

STEP BACK IN TIME

The farming community of **Grassy Cove** in southern Cumberland County is a stunning mix of spectacular scenery and unusual geography. One of only three limestone karsts in the world, the Cove is one of the largest sinkholes in the country. Covering about five square miles, Grassy Cove is a beautiful valley ringed by mountains like Brady, Black and Bear Den. Known for its karst topography, created when water dissolves rocks like limestone, the area is filled with caves and underground streams. It's also a land beyond time, with rolling green hills, acres of farmland and forest, and a charming, thriving agricultural community. Stop by the community center or one of the two century-old general stores and take in the views.

GOATS, COFFEE & SOURDOUGH--OH MY!

Where else but Cumberland County could you find high-quality coffee, homemade sourdough and friendly goats at the same time? **Copper Chick's GOAT Cafe and Soapery** in Fairfield Glade has all this and more. Grab a latte and a fresh pastry and head outside to meet the goats who provide milk for the soapery's many goat milk products.

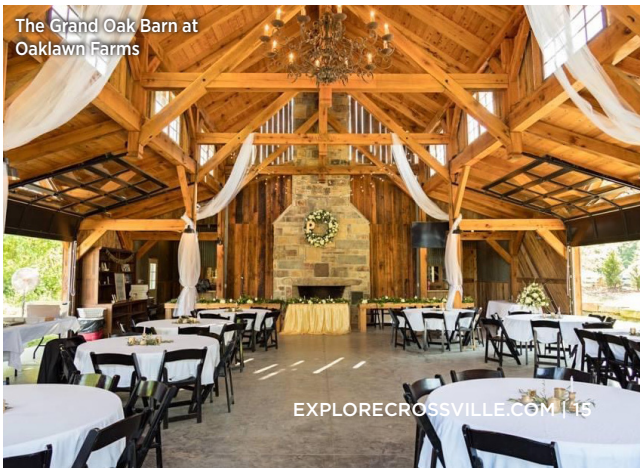
